## THE N.H. FISH & GAME DEPARTMENT DISABLED VETERANS LICENSE 10/10

Fis 1101.07 **RSA 214:13 Veterans, Totally and Permanently Disabled.** – If the applicant for a fishing and hunting license is a resident of the state, has received a discharge other than dishonorable from service in any war or police action in which the United States has been engaged and is totally and permanently disabled from such service-connected disability, the executive director shall issue a special veteran's license to said applicant. Said license shall be perpetual. The executive director shall retain the records for such licenses for a period not less than 7 years. Loss or destruction of the license after 7 years shall obligate the licensee to re-establish eligibility. A \$10 administrative fee shall be charged once, upon application to the executive director for such license.

When applying for a Disabled Veteran license, the attached application must be **completed and signed by a representative from the Veterans Administration and the applicant or submit acceptable documentation from the Veterans Administration.**

Along with the completed application, you will also need proof of Residency; we require a copy of your valid New Hampshire driver's license or non-driver's photo ID. For non-residents a valid Vermont driver's license or non-drivers photo ID is required.

If you are requesting a hunting license, please provide a copy of your previously held hunting license from any state, province of Canada or country, or a copy of your Hunter Safety Certificate from any State Authorized Hunter Education Program.

The license issued is permanent; it does not need to be renewed.

A \$10.00 one-time administration fee is required.

For a Non Resident Disabled Veterans License, currently the state of Vermont is the only state in which we have reciprocity. The same requirements apply for non-residents.

Application instructions: Complete the top half of application, have the Veterans Services Officer complete the bottom part, sign and date at the bottom of form. Remit to the Department with \$10 fee and appropriate documentation.

Per 701.02 Seniority Adjustments Due to Prior Military Service.

(a) A permanent employee shall be granted seniority credit for each full month of verified service during a period of war or armed conflict as defined by Per 701.02(b), as a result of a draft, enlistment period, or federalization in the armed forces of the United States, to a maximum of 12 months, provided:

- (1) The employee has been honorably discharged or medically discharged under honorable circumstances; and
- (2) The employee has filed proof of entitlement for adjustment due to prior military service with the director.

(b) To claim eligibility for seniority adjustment due to prior military service, the employee shall provide proof of active military service during a draft, enlistment period, or federalization in the armed forces of the United States for the following eligibility dates:

- (1) World War II between December 7, 1941 and December 31, 1946;
- (2) Korean Conflict between June 25, 1950 and January 31, 1955;
- (3) Vietnam Conflict between July 1, 1958 and December 22, 1961, if the employee earned the Vietnam service medal or the armed forces expeditionary medal;
- (4) Vietnam Conflict between December 22, 1961 and May 7, 1975;
- (5) Persian Gulf War between August 2, 1990 and the date thereafter prescribed by presidential proclamation or by law; or
- (6) Any other war or armed conflict that has occurred since May 8, 1975, and in which the employee earned an armed forces expeditionary medal or theater of operations service medal.

(c) Any permanent employee who was previously granted an adjustment or seniority due to prior military service and who voluntarily leaves state service shall not be granted an additional adjustment for the same prior military service upon rehire.
