The State of New Hampshire, NH Fish and Game Department has a temporary part-time vacancy for Bio-Aide.

Summary:

Supports research programs related to vegetation, wildlife, fish and water quality at Great Bay National Estuarine Research Reserve (GBNERR) through field and lab data collection, data management and science communication

Responsibilities:

Assists with field work related to science and stewardship in estuarine habitats, to include the monitoring of fish eelgrass, algal, crab, oyster, saltmarsh or upland species and habitats.

Assists with basic lab work, to include weighing or assessing field samples and/or to preparing samples for more extensive analysis (i.e., environmental DNA).

Performs data entry and maintenance of paper and electronic files and databases for research, restoration and monitoring efforts conducted at GBNERR to inform grey papers, journals, government reports and science related outreach to natural resource professionals.

Designs, coordinates and disseminates communications that highlight science and stewardship conducted in Great Bay via report and scientific writing, meetings/workshops, and public outreach.

Assists Reserve staff in working with fellowships, internships, students and volunteers.

Provides maintenance and oversight of the GBNERR equipment, supplies, facilities and operations.

Minimum Qualifications:

Education: Completion of high school, G.E.D. or its equivalent. Each additional year of approved formal education may be substituted for one year of required work experience.

Experience: Three years' experience in fisheries or wildlife conservation, commercial fishing, landscaping, carpentry, agriculture, outdoor recreation, or park management, including experience in operating or maintaining equipment.

License/Certification: Must possess a valid driver's license. Motor Vehicle Record (MVR) must meet the minimum standards as established by the agency.

PREFERRED WORK TRAITS: Knowledge of species and habitats common to New Hampshire. Ability to operate equipment needed to conduct field work. Excellent organizational skills. Ability to follow instructions in the field and in an office environment. Ability to use computers for organizing and entering data. Ability to communicate technical information for non-technical audiences. Ability to conduct physical tasks and work outdoors in inclement weather for extended periods; comfortable working in coastal environments including working from a boat.
