## MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

**Education/Experience:** *(only one of these needed to apply)*

- ✓ 60 college credit hours
- ✓ 2 years of full-time law enforcement experience
- ✓ 2 years of full-time military experience

**To apply to become a NH Conservation Officer you must:**

- ✓ Be at least 21 years of age
- ✓ Have at least 20/40 uncorrected vision
- ✓ Possess normal hearing without the use of hearing aids
- ✓ Have no excessive or offensive tattoos
