

Records in New Hampshire of BROOK FLOATER

Distribution maps represent locations where freshwater mussels have been documented and reported to NH Fish & Game Dept. Systematic surveys have not been conducted for most species and those surveys that have been conducted have been largely focused on dwarf wedgemussels, brook floaters, and eastern pond mussels. Therefore, in some cases, the actual distribution of freshwater mussels in NH are more extensive than what is presented here.
